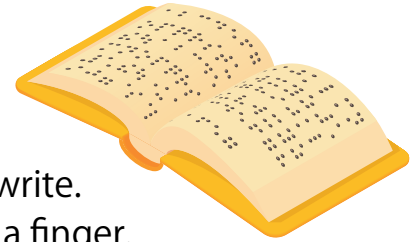
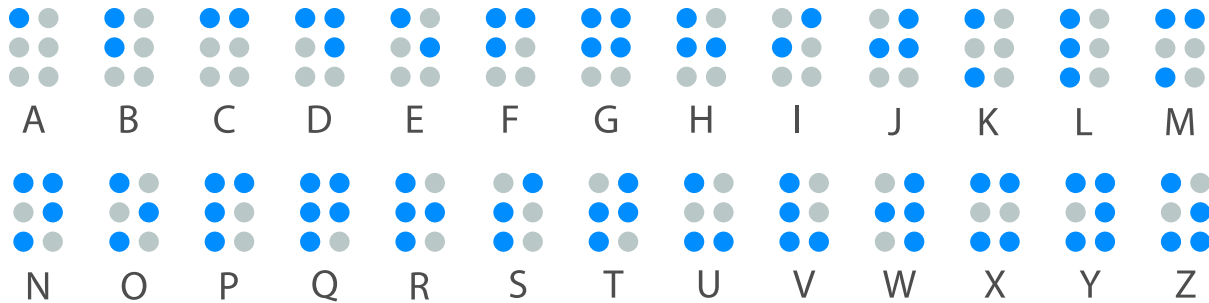


The Braille Alphabet



The Braille alphabet is used by blind people to read and write. It uses a set of raised bumps or dots that can be felt with a finger.

There are Braille books and Braille typewriters. Many buildings will have signs with Braille to help blind people find a room. We call this accessibility because it makes the building accessible to someone with limited vision.
